From the Senior Warden - Mr. P.C. Barwick

Thanks to everyone who helped to make our "Farewell to the Singers" one of the great days in the history of St. Mary's. And a special thanks to all of you who filled the church and the Parish Hall for the "reception" (which felt more like a feast!!!!!!) following the service, to all of you who participated in the presentation of gifts, and especially to Linda Clark and Anne Lindley. Linda's renderings of the church and rectory will be constant reminders of the love our congregation held for Father Michael, Teresa and Rachel. Lindley organized the reception. What a reception!!!!!!!!

After accepting Father Michael's resignation the Vestry met with Bishop Skirving in an informational type of meeting. The Bishop answered some of the key questions concerning the Vestry during a time of change. He pointed out that congregations often were not aware of the support and resources that they receive from the Diocese and The Episcopal Church as a whole and that transition time helps raise the awareness of a congregation to its denominational heritage, ministries, and resources.



Bishop Skirving said that we would be working with Canon Matt Stockard in seeking assistance in the selection of our Interim Rector and ultimately, in the calling of a Rector.

The Vestry met with Canon Stockard on Wednesday, July 13. He outlined the usual procedures during transition and answered questions from the Vestry. It is anticipated that the calling of our Interim Rector will require a much shorter time of two or three months than the calling of our next Rector.

As soon as the Vestry is able to get some idea of a timeline for the entire process we'll share that information. In the meantime, the Vestry will consider the various options for discernment knowing that we have the benefits from the work of the Renewal Works Committee.

The Parish is blessed to have Father Tom "On Board!" There have been many periods of change at St. Mary's, even in the recent past, when there was no Assistant Rector. With Father Tom and the Interim Rector the pastoral needs of the parish and ongoing support beyond worship will continue to be met.

Your Vestry understands that during this time of change that it must develop a vision of HOPEFULNESS, shared by the entire Parish. Remembering, as our Catechism says, the Christian hope is "to live with confidence in newness and fullness of life, and to await the coming of Christ in glory, and the completion of God's purpose fore the world."

Keep your vestry in your daily prayers.
