

From the Rector



I've never been on a television game show and don't expect that I ever will, which may be part of the reason why it has been SO much fun for me to cheer on my friend and fellow Episcopal priest, David Sibley (St. Paul's; Walla Walla, WA) in Jeopardy recently. David and I were Canterbury Scholars together in England the summer before our senior year in seminary (me at Duke

and him at General Theological Seminary in New York). He's incredibly smart (as the Jeopardy audience now also knows!), and he's also funny, witty, and simply a generally positive person to share time with. As I write these words, David has won 4 games! In addition to enjoying his skill at playing the game itself, there have been some other neat highlights too. It made me think of how God's perfect love is always for and with each of us - and how God showed His love to the world so beautifully and so fully through His son, Jesus. Of course, David isn't perfect - his winning streak will end sometime (even Ken Jennings lost after all!), and not even his love is perfect. But he has brought a lot of joy to many people this week, and I pray that others might also be reminded of what our Father's love holds for us all.

Consecration Sunday is Coming!



Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. St. Mary's Vestry has selected the New Consecration Sunday

Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis. New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" Each Sunday of October, we will have a guest speaker during the announcements period of our service. Then, on Consecration Sunday, October 30th, we will have a guest preacher who will include a brief period of instruction and inspiration, concluding with an opportunity for members to make their commitments as a confidential act of worship. Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday, either online or in-person. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. Thank you in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday!




Cherished Members' Luncheon Returns!


