

The sacraments are outward and visible signs of inward and spiritual grace, given by Christ as sure and certain means by which we receive that grace. (BCP, 857)

I wonder, what are some ways that you might describe having sensed God's presence in your life at some time or another? James 1:17 tells us that every good gift in our lives comes from God, so an eye towards gratitude for blessings around us will reveal countless ways that God is near. Additionally, the Episcopal Church affirms God's promises to make His presence known in certain specific occasions too. We call these sacraments.

Each time a person accepts the gift of being adopted as a child of God in baptism, or the bread & wine of communion nourishes the bodies & souls of the faithful in the Eucharist (the Great Thanksgiving!), God is most assuredly present! These are meant for every single person, which is why they are called the two great **sacraments**. The five **sacramental rites** (read more on pg. 860 of the Prayer Book) are not necessary for all persons, but only for those whom have been called to them.

Let us all rejoice and hold in prayer those who, this month, accept God's call in their lives to



be baptized, to share in communion with Christ, to take steps towards confirmation and marriage, to be reconciled, to be healed, and to be ordained. What а joyous gift it is to share in this livegiving and loving community of faith!

Vestry Nomination Process

The Vestry of St. Mary's has a vital role in the leadership of this parish, and St. Mary's will soon elect its next 4-person class of vestry leaders.

- 1. On October 21, a preliminary list of members who are eligible to serve on the vestry was shared via email. The parish office needed any necessary corrections by Sunday, October 30.
- 2. In November, nomination forms will be emailed and posted in the Narthex with instructions on the "Nomination by Ballot" process.
- 3. The Vestry's Nominating Committee (consisting of the 4 out-going members) will form a 4-person candidate slate based on the nomination ballots. In the event of a tie, the Nominating Committee will be trusted to discern an appropriate solution based on the needs of the parish.
- 4. The Annual Parish Meeting will take place during the 10:30am liturgy on Sunday, December 4, 2022 during which the 4-person slate will be voted on. Please plan now to attend worship this joyous day!

Serving on the Vestry of St. Mary's is service to Christ himself and is an honor and privilege. Please be in prayer for discernment about who you sense may be called to serve in this way and may God bless the leadership of this church.
