Consecration Sunday

ongregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

St. Mary's Vestry has selected the *New Consecration Sunday* Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, member of St. Mary's, followers of Jesus Christ, are invited to give, simply, as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

There will be ONE worship service on Consecration Sunday November 12, 2017 at 10:30 am - and during that time, we are asking members to make their financial commitments to this church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend, even if they feel strongly opposed to completing a card. During morning worship, there will be a brief period of instruction and inspiration, concluding with an opportunity for members to make their commitments as a <u>confidential</u> act of worship.

Immediately following the liturgy, we will gather for a Celebration Banquet in Moseley Hall as an act of thanksgiving for God's blessings and looking forward to God's work in, among, and through us as a church family. **Because this is a catered meal, please respond in a timely manner to the invitations that will be given out at church in the coming Sundays.** We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete giving cards, but you may expect a call if we haven't received an RSVP to the Celebration Banquet from your household.

Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday events.

Vestry Election Process

The following is excerpted from a pastoral letter that will soon be emailed to the church and made available in hard copy in the Narthex:

The Vestry of St. Mary's has a vital role in the leadership of this parish. Broadly defined by the Canons of the Episcopal Church and our diocese, the responsibilities of the vestry encompass areas of leadership and management in partnership with the Rector. Serving on the Vestry of St. Mary's is service to Christ himself and is an honor and privilege.

Twelve Vestry members serve for rotating terms of three years each. Four Vestry members are elected each year at the Annual Parish Meeting that occurs on the second Sunday of Advent (December 10, 2017).

Vestry members meet together on the third Monday of every month and occasionally in called meetings. Attendance is extremely important. Each Vestry member is responsible for overseeing at least one are of parish ministry.


Those qualified for nomination for election to the Vestry are required by canon to be adult, confirmed communicants in good standing which is defined as: A member sixteen years or older who has been faithful in corporate worship as evidenced by the receiving of Communion in this church three (3) times during the previous year, unless for good cause prevented; and, has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

A list of parishioners who are eligible was sent via email and is posted in the Narthex. Confirmed adults of the church are asked by the Vestry to nominate no more than 6 names from this list, either by emailing the names to lkelly@stmaryskinston.com or by printing the list, circling the names, and bringing the list to the church office. Emails or hard-copies must be signed by the person submitting the nomination and must be received no later than Tuesday, November 7, 2017.

Adult Christian Formation

The Adult Christian Formation Class continues its study of the Apostle Paul's Epistle to the Romans this fall. Bishop N. T. Wright calls the letter to the Christians in Rome "Paul's masterpiece." This masterpiece is all about God, who unveils divine power and grace through the good news of Christ Jesus.

"Invitation to Romans" is a video series published by Disciple Bible Study. The video lasts about 15 minutes and will be augmented with supplemental material, including the study guide to Romans from the MacArthur Bible Studies series. A free copy of the book is provided to every participating household. There will be plenty of time for discussion! We meet in Mosely Hall Sundays beginning at 9:15 am. Our Adult Christian Formation Team, led by Dr. John John, are the facilitators for this class.





The Education for Ministry program at St. Mary's has had a great start! We began meeting in September with ten seekers in the class. The group began with each of the members honing the skill of active listening and being fully present as each member shared vignettes of their lives with each other. This year all of us are exploring the Old Testament which brings us new insights as we delve into our text and the Bible together.

Our next step is to dive into the process of theological reflection which is the heart of the course. We are truly thankful to St. Mary's for supporting us in this new venture for our class. We will continue to meet throughout the year for the completion of 36 lessons.
