Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

When "the storm" hits, what should we do? On the Sunday after the joyful Celebration of New Ministry service & party, we observed the Feast of St. Mary. I mentioned in the sermon that morning that Mary couldn't see around the corner of what lay ahead in her life. Things that she never could have expected lay ahead - incredibly difficult and miraculously wonderful things. Even so, she trusted in God and said *let it be with me according to your word* and then, in time, she lived her life following her son, Jesus.

We who call St. Mary's Episcopal Church our spiritual home, likewise, can't know all that lies ahead. We don't know when "the storms" of life may come, what they will look like for us, and the impact they'll have. But we are called to have the same trusting faith that <u>God is good</u> and, therefore, has <u>good things for us</u> that will unfold in God's timing. And as we live each day in that trust, we do the best we can to follow our Lord's call to love God and to love our neighbors.

As bad as Hurricane Florence was and its impact remains on our region, it has been a blessing to see God's people answer the calls that God placed on their hearts and spring into action. Some were called to notice the literal neighbor whose needs were obvious, others to call or visit and ask about what could be done to help, others to gather with crowds and clean common areas and public spaces that are significant to the community, others to lift up their prayers for safety and healing, and still others to cook, serve, and deliver meals near and far. It was beautiful to sense worldly divisions fade during these times. God, who is at the core of every good thing, directed these all, and we give thanks! The work

towards recovery is long - be vigilant in your love!

It is fitting that in this month of October, we will also be attentive to stewardship. At St. Mary's, we understand tithing and other giving, not as our answer to the question "how can the church afford X, Y, or Z?" but rather as our response of gratitude to the ways in

which we have experienced God's blessings. Expect to hear more about this from Kevin Zoltek, who will be leading our season of Stewardship this year. **Note that on Sunday, October 28, there will only be one liturgy, at 10:30am. At that time we will gather for Consecration Sunday to make our offerings and "Estimate of Giving" for the year, followed by a Celebration Banquet in Moseley Hall.
