Welcome to St. Mary's Episcopal Church!

We are now offering two Sunday worship opportunities. One will be an online pre-recorded liturgy. The other will be an outdoor public liturgy (weather permitting), following the parameters outlined in <u>Fr. Tom's Pastoral Letter of May 14</u> and in accordance with current state Executive Orders and guidelines from the Episcopal Diocese of East Carolina.

For worshipers gathering in person, we thank you for taking seriously the measures that are in place that allow us to gather safely, especially observing six feet of physical distancing between members of unique households at all times and refraining from congregational singing. We also encourage all present to wear a face covering. These practices will make our time together safer and are appreciated as signs of love for one another.

Today's liturgy of Spiritual Communion is observed in keeping with The Book of Common Prayer's reminder that if one is unable to physically consume the consecrated bread and wine, the desire alone is enough for God to grant all the benefits of communion. This act of prayer and meditation can provide the means by which we can associate ourselves with the Eucharistic Action and open ourselves to God's grace and blessing.

A Reading from the Book of Acts:

[2:1-21]

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."
