
Christian Formation



One of the roles of the Church is to equip its members for ministry in the world. The ministry of all of the baptized is needed in order to realize God's work of building up the Kingdom here and now. For over 40 years, the Education for Ministry (EfM) course of study has been a way that Christians have better understood the tenets of the Faith and discerned the implications of the Faith on everyday life. St. Mary's is now positioned to offer this Christian Formation opportunity!

EfM is a four-year parish-based program in theological education that focuses on small-group study and practice. Participants encounter the breadth and depth of the Christian tradition and bring it into conversation with their experiences of the world as they study, worship, and engage in theological reflection together. EfM helps the faithful discover and nurture their unique call to Christian service.

Each EfM 'year' is a nine-month cycle of study. Students enroll for one cycle at a time. Groups must have between 6 and 12 members and begin their 'year' in any month from September through May. We only need a couple more participants to get started! Are you interested in learning more about EfM? If so, please talk to Mo. Judith, Fr. Tom, or Victoria Brown, who is a trained EfM mentor and has experience leading EfM groups.
