## St. Mary's Calls the Rev. Thomas P.H. Warren to be its next Rector!

After prayerfully conducting a 10-month search process in accordance with the Diocese of East Carolina and your Vestry's charge, the St. Mary's

Rector Search Committee recommended Father Tom Warren to be our new Rector. In response to this recommendation, the Vestry voted to enthusiastically accept the Search Committee's recommendation and issued an official Call to Father Tom. Father Tom accepted that Call and will become the next Rector of St. Mary's Episcopal Church!

On Sunday, January 28, his 2,372nd day of serving as the Assistant Rector at St. Mary's, Father Tom preached his 'farewell' sermon before transitioning into his new ministry as Rector. In his sermon, he jokingly referred to the next Rector, saying "I've heard some things about this guy. He's not perfect, (not by a long shot), he certainly doesn't know everything, but he loves you very much and, most importantly, he loves Jesus."

Usually, priests making a transition to a new call as Rector have to physically move to a new place of ministry. This relocation naturally offers them some time in between roles. Since the transition for Father Tom will entail much more than a simple move of office location, Father Tom will be taking some time away from the office and from Sunday morning worship at St. Mary's for reflection, prayer, and planning. You may see him around, but he will not have office hours during this time. Father Tom's first day in the Church Office as our Rector will be on Monday, February 12.

May God bless Father Tom, his wife Holly, their sons Jude & Mason, and our entire church family in this next exciting season of our ministry together!

# WEDNESDAY EVENINGS IN LENT

We are entering into a new season of ministry at St. Mary's in 2018 with the call of a new Rector . Throughout the Rector Search Process, many conversations were held about the vision for this next season. How is God calling THIS current generation of disciples to follow Jesus in THIS time and THIS place? Join Father Tom and members of our Christian Formation Committee on Wednesday Evenings this Lent, beginning on February 21, for a series of programs designed

to help us listen to God's call for our particular church family's mission in ministry to share the Good News of Jesus with each other and out into the world. A supper will be served for all participants of the program!

#### YOUMAY NOTICE...

The church calendar helps us mark time and make spiritual preparations for significant times in our lives of faith. Lent is our time of preparation for the celebration of Christ's victory over death and the season of Easter. In anticipation of that season of exuberance and feasting, Christians in the Anglican tradition observe Lent by "self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." Our worship together changes during the season as well. Some things you may notice include our services beginning with "A Penitential Order," fewer candles, the more solemn purple color of vestments and paraments, our restraint from saying "Alleluia," the use of a special 'fraction anthem' at communion, and singing the Trisagion rather than the more festive "Gloria."

## WORSHIP

The Season of Lent begins February 14, 2018





#### **ASH WEDNESDAY**

The imposition of ashes is often a central part of Ash Wednesday worship. Ashes have a long history in biblical and church traditions. In scripture, ashes or dust symbolize frailty or death (Gen. 18:27), sadness or mourning (Esther 4:3), judgment (Lam. 3:16), and repentance (Jon. 3:6). Some traditions also have considered ash a purifying or cleansing agent. All these images are caught up in the church's use of ashes as a symbol appropriate for Lent. In Christ's passion we see God's judgment on evil; in our penitence we express sorrow and repentance for our sins; in our rededication we show that we are purified and renewed.

The ashes we use at St. Mary's on Ash Wednesday are the made by burning the previous year's palms from Palm Sunday. Worshippers at the Ash Wednesday liturgy are invited to come forward to have the priest make a cross on each person's forehead (the "imposition"), saying "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Ash Wednesday is one of only two fast days for Episcopalians on the church calendar and it is an obligation for all Episcopalians to make a proper beginning of Lent by attending an Ash Wednesday liturgy. St. Mary's will offer the Imposition of Ashes and celebrate the Holy Eucharist on **Wednesday**, **February 14th** at:

7:00 p.m. ~ Church (with music)



#### The Way of the Cross

St. Mary's will be offering the Way of the Cross on Friday evenings at 5:45 p.m., beginning February 16th. Sometimes called the Stations of the Cross, this short devotional experience engages

our whole bodies as worshipers move to each of the fourteen markers in the church, recalling a different event of Jesus' Passion.

The Way of the Cross is an especially poignant way "that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby [God] has given us life and immortality," to quote the Prayer Book's collect for Palm Sunday. May you be blessed by this powerful tradition of the Lenten season.

## Christian Formation


The Adult Christian Formation Class will studying the Book of Psalms during the Spring. The class will be using a study guide from "The Wiersbe Bible Study Series."
