The CORE VALUES of St. Mary's Episcopal Church are:

- Christ-Centered and Kingdom-Oriented in our teaching and purpose for mission.
- Anglican Tradition frames our liturgy and theology.
- Loving God and Neighbor is at the heart of all of our actions.
- Alive in the Holy Spirit seeking God's active presence in directing our efforts and resources towards building the Kingdom of God.

#### What's at our Core?

There's a lot of talk in business leadership circles about the sort of mission and vision statements that our vestry adopted at the end of 2018 – and with good reason. A proverb in Scripture says "without vision, the people perish" (Proverbs 28:19). The heart of this concept is that, in order to thrive, people need to be connected with the purpose God has for us!

Among the organizational statements that St. Mary's has for this season of our life together is a set of core values. Very simply put, these are things we behold as treasures in our lives of faith and they are essential to our life and witness as Christians in this community. The first Core Value is that we are "Christ-Centered and Kingdom-Oriented in our teaching and purpose for mission."

Jesus needs to always be the center - the core - of our very being and all that we do. We know that we are not who we are meant to be without Him at our heart. The relationship we have with Him is the most valuable thing we have and it must be at the front of all that we consider as individuals and as a church. Whatever we teach and do should be at outgrowth of our relationship with Jesus.

"Kingdom-Oriented" is a way of expressing our conviction that God is at work in our lives and in this world now! Everything that is truly good comes from God and draws this world closer to the perfect peace God intends for all. The image for this state of perfection is the Kingdom of God and it has come near in Christ and spreads through the loving work of the faithful who act in His name.

Our first core value emphasizes that <u>Jesus is the center</u> of all we are and hope to be, and that everything we strive to do must be <u>aligned with the growth and spread of God's Kingdom</u> here on earth. This is where we start! From this place, we know that we have good work to do in sharing God's Good News!



older (even adults!). Typically, Torchbearers are the youngest, Gospel Bearers are in 10th & 11th grade, and Crucifers are in the 12th grade or older. All are invited to attend an Acolyte Training session on Sunday, Feb 10th after the 10:30 am liturgy.

## Training for Lectors

History and diocesan policy place high priority on development of strong lay ministries. From colonial days when East Carolina churches functioned almost completely under the care of vestries, since clergy were rarely available, the Diocese has been blessed with



exceptionally strong lay leadership. The Prayer Book's Catechism (p. 855) describes the ministry of lay persons:

the ministry of lay persons is to represent Christ and His Church; to bear witness to Him wherever they may be; and, according to the gifts given them, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in the life, worship, and governance of the Church.

Especially in the worship of the Church, the whole people of God are represented in our worship services as lay people, as well as clergy, enable the corporate worship of the gathered community of the faithful!



## Christian Formation

Our goal at St. Mary's is to strengthen children, youth, and adults in their knowledge and love of Jesus Christ, through worship, education, fellowship, and mission.

### SAVE THE DATE: SHROVE TUESDAY Pancake Supper



Join us on Tuesday, March 5th, for our annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper in Moseley Hall from 5-7 pm.

The celebration will consist of more sausage and pancakes than you can handle! (Yes, that's a challenge!)

The cost of the meal is \$8, or \$6 for children under 10, and no more than \$28 for a family of 2 adults and children under 10. Proceeds from the dinner will be used for youth scholarships.

Shrove Tuesday is the last day before the beginning of Lent. Though "shrove" derives from the word *shrive* (i.e. to repent), Shrove Tuesday is actually a day for great celebrations that use up cooking ingredients which many will forgo during Lent.
