

Life is full of decisions. Some easy (don't touch that red-hot stove-top!). Some more difficult (what school to attend?). Some seemingly inconsequential and some seem to carry the weight of the world. March begins with Lenten decisions: selecting spiritual disciplines, voting in Lent Madness (check it out!), what to prioritize in order to draw closer to God. "Super Tuesday" primary election decisions quickly follow on March 2 (the right to vote is a valuable gift to be cherished and considered carefully). You certainly have other decisions before you each day.

I wonder: how does your faith inform your decisionmaking? The intentional seeking of God's guidance through prayer, study of Scripture & the tradition, and reason is often an early indicator that the Gospel of Jesus has taken root in someone's heart. This shifts the focus of authority from our own preferences and opinions to faithfully seeking God's heart. Another word for this is discernment.

As you faithfully discern the decisions that are before you, I also ask you to pray for the members of St. Mary's who are involved in the search process for a Ministry Coordinator for children, youth, & their families. The job description is on our website for you to see and share. In all things, may God's will be done. +

# New Choral Scholar Fund

A new fund has been established for the advancement of choral scholars at St. Mary's. Hopefully

most of you are now aware of our first choral scholar, soprano Michael Adams. Michael has added much needed support to our choir. She is funded by revenues from the Sitterson Music Fund. The new Choral Scholars Fund will be a separate fund which will be allowed to grow until it is large enough to provide revenue to fund additional scholars. A substantial contribution has already been made to the fund and it is hoped that continuing contributions will be made. Gifts to memorialize or honor members and friends of St. Mary's, particularly lovers of the music program, would be most appropriate.

While this is a new concept for St. Mary's, choral scholar programs have been in place for years in other area churches such as First Presbyterian in Kinston. Most of you are aware of the increasing difficulty of providing quality choral service music on a volunteer basis. Choral scholars, usually four, (one for each voice part: soprano, alto, tenor and bass) provide the continuity and support needed to maintain and grow the choir's effort to present inspiring choral music on a regular basis.



St. Mary's offers the Way of the Cross on Friday evenings at 5:45 p.m., beginning February 28th and ending April 3rd. This short devotional experience is both tactile and meditative. As we move to each of the fourteen markers throughout the church, a different event

This is an especially poignant way "that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby [God] has given us life and immortality," to quote the Prayer Book's collect for Palm Sunday. #### Lent Choral Evensong

Wednesday evenings in Lent will begin with Choral Evensong at 5:30pm in the church (except for March 4th and April 1st, when healing prayers will be offered). Choral Evensong refers to the daily office

liturgy of Evening Prayer, whenever most of it is set to music and accompanied by a choir. Since the first Book of Common Prayer in 1549, Choral Evensong has been an evening offering in cathedrals and churches throughout the Anglican Communion. There is no better way to begin our Wednesday evenings together than to gather for worship, to hear God's Word, to pray for ourselves and on behalf of others, and to sing God's praise.

Then, on **Sunday, March 29th, from 5:30-6:30pm**, St. Mary's invites you to experience a Choral Evensong *featuring the Schola Cantorum of the Episcopal Diocese of East Carolina*. The Schola Cantorum began in late 1990 as a way to form a temporary choir of singers pulled from their respective parish choirs to provide music

for a choral evensong for the Diocesan Convention the following February and has grown to include members not only from the Diocese of East Carolina but from the Diocese of North Carolina and other dominations as well. The name "Schola Cantorum" means school of singing, and its mission is to sing music in the Anglican tradition at the service of Evensong around the Diocese and beyond. It is with great "JOY!" that we welcome Schola Cantorum to St. Mary's and we hope you will include this as part of your journey through Lent.


