From the Rector

Dear friends,

There is much to celebrate as we begin the summer months of 2021! The pages of this BellRinger reflect much more flexibility that results from the CDC's report of vaccine efficacy and subsequent state and diocesan lifting of many pandemic-related restrictions. As I continue to try to avoid using the phrase "new normal" during the pandemic, I rejoice in the "current faithful" ways of living and worshipping together that we have discerned are fitting!

Highlights of our current guidelines for public worship at St. Mary's:

- 1. All social distancing requirements are lifted at St. Mary's Church.
- 2. Regarding face coverings:

All may wear a face covering. Each of us will have a different comfort level about being with others in public. Those gathering for public worship should feel welcome to wear a face covering if they prefer to do so. Some may choose to wear a face covering when they cannot maintain a certain physical distance from others.

Some should wear a face covering. The CDC recommends that all persons over age two who are not vaccinated should wear a face covering indoors when other people are present. This applies to children who are too young to be vaccinated, those who cannot be vaccinated, and those who have not chosen to be vaccinated.

None must wear a face covering. In this sense, we are following our Governor's most recent Executive Order. But we certainly hope that all who should wear a face covering will do so.

- 3. Singing is once again to be a joyful part of congregational worship at St. Mary's! I invite you all to wholeheartedly lift a joyful noise the next time you have the opportunity!! Musicians are afforded the same choices as others with regards to distancing and face coverings. If there is a favorite hymn that you've especially missed singing, please tell our Organist, Sharon Veitch, or the co-chairs of the Music Task Group: Pam Mazingo & Bonnie Holton.
- 4. The Eucharist has returned to being offered at the altar rail, while it will continue to be brought to anyone who desires it in the pews (just tell an usher). At this time, we will continue to offer only bread at communion, per diocesan guidance. Before too much more time passes, the diocese will develop and distribute recommendations for how to most safely share wine during communion.
- 5. There are other elements of worship at St. Mary's that have historically been part of local practice and preference which will continue to be discerned with respect to if, when, and how to be reintroduced to our corporate worship.
- 6. We will continue to offer weekly online liturgies, posting them to our <u>Facebook page</u> and <u>YouTube</u> <u>channel</u>.
- 7. Beginning June 13, two fully-staffed nurseries will resume operation: one for infants and one for older children. The nurseries will be open every Sunday from 9-11am until further notice. The church's Nursery Guidelines will continue to reflect current COVID protocols, guided by the NC Department of Health & Human Services. All adults and volunteers involved in the nurseries and other children's ministries in which the children are too young to be vaccinated are expected to wear a face covering when indoors with the children.
- 8. We are now able to return to hosting gatherings & receptions with food after worship and at other times. As the Fellowship Committee works through the details of what to offer and when, we will be mindful of considering how to make these activities safer, such as including the provision of individual servings rather than the offering of a potluck meal, per diocesan guidance.






