From the Rector

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." ~ John 14:27

Dear People and Friends of St. Mary's,

The Gospel lesson that we read together on Sunday, May 22, spoke of the peace that Jesus gives to His followers. He spoke of this gift to His disciples during a categorically un-peace-filled time. It was during their last hours together before His arrest and death, and these words about peace were intended to carry them, not only through those times, but also for the rest of their lives and ministries that would be marked in part by hard work, conflict, and persecution.

During our own time together in worship on May 22, we already knew that the times in which we live today are fraught with a lack of peace in many ways. The headlines pointed our attentions towards war in Ukraine and beyond, financial instability, questions about the future of our own civic institutions, callous debates about abortion that question what constitutes a life that matters as well as what it means to care for our neighbor, not to mention the very real struggles and heartache that we and our literal neighbors hold. Then, two days later came another horrific school shooting that has devastated a small community in Texas and sent shockwaves throughout every community and individual heart that is open to feel the pain of others.

Did we hear Jesus wrong? Was He mistaken about this whole "peace" promise? No. Jesus spoke of the peace of God that is every bit as real as the tumultuous events that we experience and witness today... every bit as real as what the disciples and every generation since have experienced. The peace of God is every bit as real as the hardships that He Himself would experience on the cross too. Under the surface of the most difficult, tragic, or evil realities is an abiding and constant presence that tells us again and again that no one is ever completely alone, that love is more powerful than any other force in this world, that death never has the last word when Jesus is invited into the conversation. The peace that Jesus promises is the fruit that sustains the faithful through these, and any other, tragedies and conflicts. As unlikely as it may seem to be on Good Friday, God keeps God's promises, and Easter is assured. Life is assured. That is the Christian hope.

As you step into the summer months ahead, I pray that you will remember Jesus' promise of peace. Seek to engage fully into the opportunities for good that each day holds through prayer, service, and building relationships with others. The pages of this BellRinger invite you into many such opportunities and I look forward to seeing you in these times. In times of celebration, as in times of grief or trial, may we remember the deepest truth of God's promises, and embrace the peace that they offer.



entecost is a Principle Feast Day of the church calendar, celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter. This year, Pentecost is June 5th, and we are glad to have special music from City Lights Jazz. While there is an ancient Jewish holiday of the same name, for Christians, Pentecost commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem observing the Jewish custom. Because the Holy Spirit has inspired the spread of the Good News of Jesus to the world, Pentecost is often understood to be the birthday of the Church. Happy Birthday!!! On this day, the clergy wear RED vestments, and the altar will be adorned with red hangings. It is even customary for the people of the congregation to wear RED as well.









From the early days of the faith, Pentecost became one of the days set aside to celebrate baptisms. In the waters of baptism, we are adopted by God as His children and made members of Christ's Body, the Church, and inheritors of the kingdom of God. In the Episcopal Church, Pentecost remains one of the days that is "especially appropriate" for baptism, recognizing, of course, that any time the faithful can gather for this occasion is reason to celebrate. We are thrilled to have a baptism planned for Henry McNairy, son of Allie and Jack McNairy (and brother of JJ) on Pentecost Sunday during the 10:30am liturgy. We will renew our Baptismal vows at both in-person and online services that day as well. Please keep Henry, his baptismal sponsors, and his family in your prayers as we welcome the newest member of the household of God!
