## New Trial Sunday Schedule in the Fall

In consultation with the clergy, wardens, and vestry, St. Mary's is going to engage a new Sunday morning schedule as a trial beginning in the Fall. These changes are the result of many recommendations that have been fielded from a great variety of groups within our parish family. It is our hope that the result of this trial will be either a new rhythm of life together that is helpful as we nurture a stronger sense of community, or a confirmation that we should stick with our existing Sunday schedule. Beginning on **Sunday, September 10**, our Sunday schedule will be:

**8:00 am - Holy Eucharist, Rite 1, spoken**

**9:15 am - Christian Formation for all ages**

**10:30 am - Holy Eucharist, Rite 2, with choir**

This trial will run through, to the end of, the season of Advent, at which time the church leadership will announce what will happen next.



# Christian Formation

## Education for Ministry - What You Can Expect



**Education for Ministry is a four-year program of intense Biblical and theological study. The class will be held on a week-night (to be determined) beginning in September.**

**Year 1 focuses on The Hebrew Bible.** Texts include : A Short Introduction to the Hebrew Bible, 2nd Ed. by John J. Collins. The Holy Bible, Old Testament and Apocrypha

**Year 2 focuses on The New Testament.** Texts include: Introducing the New Testament by Mark Allan Powell. The Holy Bible, New Testament.

**Year 3 focuses on Christian History.** Texts include: : Christianity: The First Three Thousand Years by Diarmaid MacCulloch.

**Year 4 focuses on Theology.** Texts include: Theology: A Very Short Introduction by David F. Ford (Oxford University Press, 2013.) Mysteries of Faith by Mark McIntosh (A Cowley Publication Book, 2000.) The Christian Moral Life, by Timothy F. Sedgwick (Seabury Books, 2008.) My Neighbor's Faith, editors Jennifer Howe Peace, Or N. Rose, Gregory Mobley (Orbis Books, 2012.)

An EfM Reading and Reflection Guide provides weekly reading assignments, reflection questions, and additional supportive resources for the group.

There are 2 Interludes throughout the year. All seminar participants read and study the Interlude material together. The texts to be read during the Interludes are:

Care for Creation : A Franciscan Spirituality of the Earth by Ilia Delio O.S.F., Keith Douglass Warner O.F.M., Pamela Wood

Transformed Lives – Making Sense of Atonement Today by Cynthia Crysdale

Each "year" is a nine-month cycle of study. Students enroll for one cycle at a time.

Cost of Education for Ministry is \$375.00 per year. Scholarship monies are available.
