## From the Rector

**“Preach the Gospel at all times, and when necessary use words.”**

*-A quotation attributed to St. Francis of Assisi*

This is a favorite quotation of many Christians. It reminds us of three things. First, the Good News (Gospel) of Jesus is meant to be shared openly, widely, joyfully, at every turn and opportunity with everyone! This is simply what all Christians are called to do! Second, our actions matter SO much. Whether we are aware of it or not, our actions preach. They share messages that can run the widest spectrum between loving, uplifting, and caring, to apathetic, selfish, hateful, and so much more. When we know and rejoice in the love of Jesus in our lives, we can't help but preach about that love in how we care, give, serve, and love through our actions. When those actions are noticed, that's preaching! And thirdly, this quotation reminds us that sometimes words really are necessary, though not always. We all would do well to ask God to help us discern when words are needed, and when they are not - and then follow His Spirit's lead, trusting that silent action can speak volumes, as well as trusting that God's words would come to us in the moment that speech is needed.

As we begin a new Program Year here at St. Mary's, there are so many ways that the Gospel will be proclaimed, in word and/or deed, through a variety of ministries. And I am delighted to see many ministries being able to take on more of their pre-pandemic shape. This BellRinger shares information about many of them. Along with what is written here, our Ministry Fair on September 11 will be a wonderful opportunity to learn more and help you discern God's call to join in hearing and proclaiming the Gospel!



Among them is a new ministry being formed to help our liturgies reach those unable to be present in person for worship. With the installation of livestreaming equipment nearing completion (see lights & speakers in the image), plans are being made to establish this ministry as an integral worship, pastoral care, and outreach connection to the world in need of receiving Jesus' Good News. 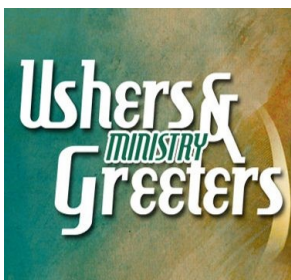


### Monthly Outdoor Worship & Hootenannies

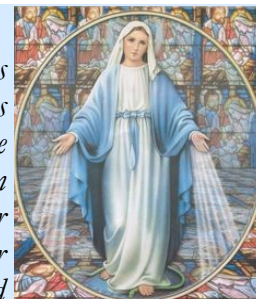
## Worship

### *Who was St. Mary the Virgin?*

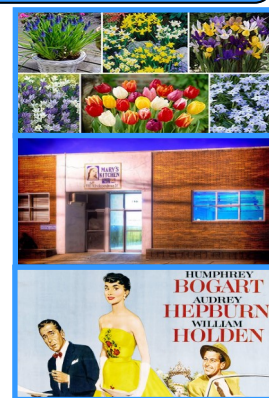
*Mary was a young Israelite Jewish woman of Nazareth in Galilee and the mother of Jesus. Christians believe that she conceived her son, Jesus the Christ, miraculously by the power of the Holy Spirit. This took place when she was already betrothed to Joseph and was awaiting the culminating marriage ceremony. She married Joseph and accompanied him to Bethlehem, where Jesus was born. The Virgin Mary is viewed as the ultimate compassionate human being, and holy, in part, because of her willingness to participate in God's plans for her life. The Virgin Mary is known and honored for her faithfulness to God, compassion for her Son and others, perseverance through incredible hardships, and much more. These must have been among the reasons why the Virgin Mary was chosen as the matron saint of this church nearly 200 years ago. Like our matron saint, we too are called to carry out ministries of faithfulness, compassion, perseverance, and much more each and every day of our lives.*

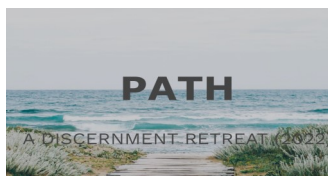
## Sacred Ground: A Film-Based Dialogue Series on Race & Faith

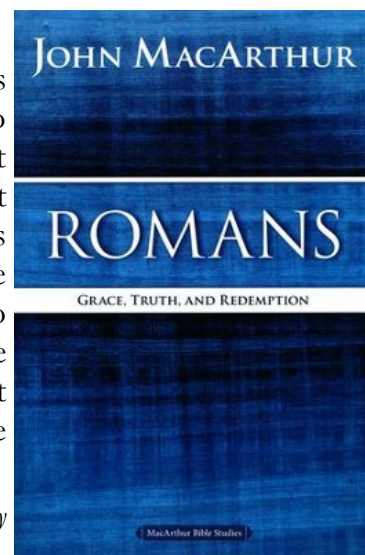
