The Vision Statement of St. Mary's

Through the love of Jesus, St. Mary's will be a joy-filled Christian community for all individuals through:

- inspired joy-filled worship in the Anglican tradition
- faithful apostolic teaching that feeds the mind and soul
- compassionate response to the needs of all, with special focus on the needs of the aged, children, and those in crisis
- partnerships with neighboring faith communities and others
- meaningful relationships with the neighborhood
- honoring God in rhythms of work and rest, and in the intentional use of all resources

There is a proverb in the Bible that warns "without vision, the people perish." A St. Mary's parishioner once offered an interpretation of this verse, rephrased in positive words: "with vision, the people thrive." In both cases, the point is clear that we, as individuals and as communities, need to keep our focus sharp on what it is that God is calling us to be and to do. Having this vision in words and oftrevisited is helpful to remind us of where we are heading.

Our Vision Statement is the result of the vestry and clergy's prayerfully asking "what do we believe God is calling St. Mary's to be in the future?" These six visionary points are the characteristics that we hope to display. This doesn't mean that St. Mary's can't be described by these points now, of course, but they point us clearly in the direction of the priorities that we sense God calling us to have. Notice that each of the six points is rooted in Jesus' love, marked by joy (a fruit of the Holy Spirit), and meant for God's people (everyone!).

The first is "inspired joy-filled worship in the Anglican tradition." This point is so important because it calls us to express our joy in the Lord whenever we offer our gifts of praise and thanksgiving to God in our liturgies. Worship is the believer's gift to God. Whenever Christians come together on Sunday mornings, it's like a mini-Easter: a celebration in thanksgiving that Jesus' resurrection gives assurance of eternal life to all who share in it.

At St. Mary's, we cherish the guide that the Book of Common Prayer offers in leading us in our gifts of praise: engaging God's word, proclaiming the full Gospel, singing songs of praise, confessing our sins and hearing God's forgiveness, splashing in the lifegiving waters of baptism, being fed at the Lord's table, and being sent out with Gospel purpose. With each 'AMEN!' we say, we effectively say "YES!!!" to the prayers and praise of countless apostles, disciples, and other believers who have come before us, and take our place with all who follow The Way of Jesus today. That, dear friends, is reason for GREAT JOY and a beautiful vision!

## **Episcopal Farmworker Ministry**



## Worship






