A Letter from the Senior Warden, Mr. P.C. Barwick



It is with great joy that the vestry of St. Mary's announces the near-arrival of two leaders to our community of faith. **The Rev. Judith Reese** (she prefers "Judith") has accepted the call as our Interim Rector and **Mrs. Sharon Veitch** has accepted the call as our new Organist and Choir Director. You will have plenty of opportunities to meet and greet them soon. Until then, here is some introductory information.

We are anticipating Judith's arrival around the 1st of November and expect her to be with us for 12 months. She and her husband, David, will occupy the Rectory as their residence.

Judith grew up in Birmingham, AL and lived in Memphis for two decades before coming to NC in 2014 as the interim rector of Holy Trinity in Fayetteville. She comes to St. Mary's from Christ Episcopal Church in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

Judith graduated from the University of Alabama at Birmingham with a bachelor's degree in Occupational Therapy and a master's degree in Public Health with a major emphasis in epidemiology and biostatistics. Before moving to Memphis, she was on the research faculty at the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Medicine primarily in Maternal-Fetal Medicine and Neonatology.

After completing her Masters of Divinity at the Memphis Theological Seminary in 1999, she entered the ordained ministry, first in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and later in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Judith's call to congregational transition and conflict led her to a vocation in interim ministry.

It was a deep desire for a more sacramental life of faith that led Judith to the Episcopal Church and there she has found a true home. To prepare for ordination, she spent a year studying at The School of Theology at the University of the South at Sewanee, TN. She currently is continuing her studies as a student in the doctoral program at Sewanee.

Judith's husband, David, is a manufactures' representative in the hardware industry. Their grown daughter, Jillian Reese Smith, is a critical care nurse, currently in training to be a nurse anesthetist in the University of Tennessee Nursing School. Jillian's husband, Richard Smith, is a professor at the UT Medical School. They have one son, Marshall.






Episcopalians define baptism as "full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body the Church" (Book of Common Prayer, Pg. 312). While baptisms are occasions to be celebrated anytime, the Prayer Book highlights four feasts of the church that are especially appropriate: the Easter Vigil, the Day of Pentecost, the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord, and All Saints' Day. This year, we will celebrate All Saints' Sunday on November 6th with several baptisms already planned for that day at St. Mary's!

Fittingly, after church that day, en lieu of Christian Formation classes, there will be a wonderful **Baptismal Reception in Moseley Hall** to celebrate our common lives together in Christ and welcome the newly baptized into the Family of God. These would be fine occasions for every member of the St. Mary's Church Family to **extend a personal invitation to a friend or neighbor**, especially one who doesn't have a church home, to come to St. Mary's and celebrate God's offer of adoption for us all.

Later in the afternoon (5:00 p.m.) we will gather for our traditional **All Saints' Evensong** where we will light a candle for members of our church family who have died during the past year and remember those whose cremains have been interred in the St. Francis Garden. Please invite your friends to join us in remembering departed loved ones.

Christian Formation



The book called *The Story* is a best-selling abridged chronological Bible. There are no verse references in the text, and the segments of scripture are woven together with transition text written to connect the storyline so it reads like a seamless story. For people new to the Bible, this way of reading scripture will offer a narrative style that is more familiar to modern readers and it provides a holistic and sequential picture of the storyline of scripture. For seasoned Bible veterans, the chronological arrangement of the highlighted texts make it easy to see how whole Biblical story unfolded over time and fits together in a single grand narrative. Reading through *The Story* triggers interest and understanding, and drives people back to the original Bible texts for further exploration.

You will find a list of all the passages included in each chapter of *The Story* on the "Chart of References" pages in the back of the book. Additional versions of the list are provided in the "Online Resource Library". One of the most common requests of people is for footnoted references or an indication of the scripture references somewhere within each chapter. In order to preserve the story-like reading of the passages, the scripture references are intentionally not provided with the text. Without the standard points of reference and biblical structures, readers of *The Story* are likely to experience new discoveries within familiar passages, and that is one of the main purposes of this book.

On Sunday, October 2nd, we will pick up where we left off last Spring with Chapter 18. All are welcome to join in, even if you missed last year. As with last year, one copy of *The Story* and *The Participant's Guide* are offered free to each participating household. The books are on a table in the Narthex. To keep track of the books we ask that you write your family's name on the sheet next to the books. If you would like to purchase your own private copy, the cost is \$16 for both books.

We look forward to your participation in this learning experience. May *The Story*, become part of your story.
