

Christianity is relational.

This begins with how we understand who God is: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit relational in character within the Triune godhead. And that relational starting point flows out into everything else. Christians are meant to have three areas relationship in mind at all times: relationship with God (through prayer, Scripture reading, worship, etc.), our relationship with each other (our families, friendships, neighbors, and all members of the human family), and our relationship with the rest of creation (we have, after all, been called to be careful stewards of this earth). When all of our decisions and actions are filtered through these three areas, the Church offers a beautifully unique witness to what good living looks like.

St. Mary's has been in our current neighborhood since the late 1950's, and while there are already many good examples of wonderful relationships, our leadership has noted that the relationships with our literal neighbors is incredibly important and will be a priority of our efforts in the coming months.

Especially at Christmas, we celebrate that God is *with* us in every part of our lives. May we always follow Jesus' example to truly be *with* our neighbors, sharing life *with* one another and drawing closer to our God together.

Advent Quiet Day



During the four weeks of Advent, we prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth through prayer and reflection. We contemplate the First Coming of Jesus as Savior and look for practical ways to observe the holiness of the season in our everyday lives. Contemplation and reflective prayer encourage us during this season, and we hope you will join us at St. Mary's on Saturday, December 21 from 9:30am-Noon for a contemplative Advent Quiet Morning under the leadership of the Reverend Mary McKnight.

Reverend McKnight was raised in Ohio but spent childhood summers in North Carolina with family. Following her undergraduate studies in Chicago, she entered Seminary at Union Theological Seminary in

NYC and was ordained in 1981. During her years in ministry, Rev. McKnight initiated the LOGOS program, Kerygma Bible Study, Disciple Bible Study, Stephen Ministry, and the Unbinding the Gospel series. Rev. McKnight has retired from full-time pastoral duties but continues to be very interested in spirituality, preaching, adult education, small group ministry, community building within churches, and carrying the gospel to those outside the church. Rev. McKnight resides in Wilmington with her husband Tom (also a pastor) and is an active contemplative leader at St. Paul's Episcopal Church (Wilmington) where she offers contemplative mini-retreats and spiritual direction.

On our Advent Quiet Morning, we hope to pause . . . to be still . . . and listen to God's voice.

An afternoon of Christmas caroling is planned for Sunday, December 22nd ~ we'll meet at the church






Poinsettias for Christmas


BILL CONNOLLY
