Dear Parish Family,

There is never an easy way to say goodbye. It is especially tough for a priest to say goodbye to a congregation, because, as has been the case for us, in the past and now, our church family *is* our family. At a special meeting of the Vestry on May 18, 2016, I tendered my resignation as Rector of St. Mary's Episcopal Church. My last day at St. Mary's will be Sunday, June 12, 2016.

Teresa and I have greatly enjoyed our ministry with you at St. Mary's. I believe the Holy Spirit led us here in the summer of 1999 to help St. Mary's grow from being a church that supports outreach mostly through generous donations of money, to people putting their faith in action by giving of their time, talents and treasures.

There have been many things at St. Mary's which have touched my heart. It has been a privilege to sit with the dying and comfort the afflicted; to join in celebrating with you joyful events, such as weddings and baptisms; watched as Vestry members took steps of faith to begin new ministries and programs and more. I especially appreciate your ministry to me and my family at the deaths of my own father and mother.

I have been pleased to see all that we can do when you put your minds to it. St. Mary's is a wonderful place. You have been a blessing to me and my family. You have a beautiful worship space; a strong tradition of holy liturgy; a generous outreach ministry to the community and beyond; and a dedicated Vestry. I am joyful for all who share their ministry in this place and pray that each of you will continue to support and grow in the ministries of St. Mary's.

In the future, your Wardens and Vestry will lead you in the search to call a new priest to be Rector, with their own set of skills, and that means the big C word, i.e. change. They may want to do things differently, and that is OK. I remember a parishioner saying when I was leaving a former parish, "Oh Father, we just hate to see you go because it means we have to break-in another priest." I was never sure whether she was sad to see me go or was looking forward to breaking in the new priest."

As with any relationship it takes time to get used to each other. Please be patient with them as you were patient with me. I am sure that as you get to know your new Rector you will find that person has a wealth of knowledge and skills that will benefit St. Mary's. Give the Holy Spirit time to work in you and them to set a new path for your parish.

As is the custom in the Episcopal Church, Teresa and I will not be back, at least not for the next three years. This means I will not be able to officiate or attend weddings, baptisms or funerals, or other parish events. This I believe will be more difficult for us than it will be for you. Your new Rector will need to get established in this parish without interference from your past Rector. I'm sure we may run into each

other from time time in Kinston or at diocesan functions. will always be happy to greet you and to ask about you and your family, but will not converse with you about the state of affairs or events at St. Mary's.

Rachel will continue for now to live



and work in Kinston. I have asked Bishop Skirving and the Vestry, that should there be a time for Rachel to get married, that should she so want, that I might be able to marry her at St. Mary's. They have been gracious in saying yes.

I am not retiring no, not yet. I have decided for my remaining full-time years in ministry to

Commissioners present award to Dick Archie




"What Women of the Bible are Telling Us Today"



tradition, reason, and humor. Freeman's hope is to draw contemporary women deeper into God's sacred circle.






The Year of Luke's Gospel
