#### The Vision Statement of St. Mary's

Through the love of Jesus, St. Mary's will be a joy-filled Christian community for all individuals through:

- inspired joy-filled worship in the Anglican tradition
- faithful apostolic teaching that feeds the mind and soul •

compassionate response to the needs of all, with special focus on the needs of the aged, children, and those in crisis

- partnerships with neighboring faith communities and • others
- meaningful relationships with the neighborhood

honoring God in rhythms of work and rest, and in the intentional use of all resources

Children get it. So often, I've witnessed the youngest members of our community respond to a situation with empathy. If they see a friend experiencing sadness, they'll offer a hug. If they witness a fall resulting in a bruise or scrape, they'll be the first to call for a band-aid (one with colors of course!). One thing that I can't think of right now is an example of a young child, once understanding that someone near them is in distress, not caring at all. I wonder where you have experienced compassionate response in your life.

Compassion is central to the Christian faith. Just think of the story of salvation: God is witness to humanity's distress in all of its forms, but doesn't stay far off. In the person of Jesus, God was fully present with this world, even suffering with it and it through His sacrifice redeeming and That is compassion: com (meaning resurrection. "with" or "together") and passion (meaning "to suffer"). Jesus modeled this through His ministry and taught that all who might follow Him would follow in His heart of compassionate love as well.

It is impossible to imagine the future of St. Mary's and what God is calling this community to be without specifically highlighting compassionate response. In particular, we have sensed a renewed interest in focus on the needs of the aged, children, and those in crisis. Of course, there is a legacy at St. Mary's of ministries to and with the aged (Cherished Members outreach), children (St. Mary's Nursery School, Hand in Hand with Northwest Elementary School), and those in crisis (Mary's Kitchen, response made possible through the Rector's Discretionary Fund, mission trips), to name a few. May God continue to bless these ministries! And may St. Mary's always seek out the fullest picture of the needs in our midst and how God would have the church respond.



"Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you." (Colossians 3:12-13)

# **Consecration Sunday Is Coming!**

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

St. Mary's Vestry has selected the <u>New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program</u> as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis.

<u>New Consecration Sunday</u> is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. <u>New Consecration Sunday</u> encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

There will be ONE liturgy on Consecration Sunday, October 20, 2019 at 10:30am - and during that time, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to this church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend, even if they feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship, our guest preacher will include a brief period of instruction and inspiration, concluding with an opportunity for members to make their commitments as a <u>confidential</u> act of worship.

Immediately following the liturgy, we will gather for a Celebration Banquet in Moseley Hall as an act of thanksgiving for God's blessings and looking forward to God's work in, among, and through us as a church family. Because this is a catered meal, please respond in a timely manner to the invitations you will have received.

### Vestry



The Vestry of St. Mary's has a vital role in the leadership of this parish. Broadly defined by the Canons of the Episcopal Church and our diocese, the responsibilities of the vestry encompass areas of leadership and management in partnership with the Rector. Serving on the Vestry of St. Mary's is service to Christ Himself and is an honor and privilege. Vestry members meet together on the third Monday of every month and occasionally in called meetings. Attendance is extremely important. Each Vestry member is responsible for overseeing at least one area of parish ministry. Twelve Vestry members serve

for rotating terms of three years each. Four Vestry members are elected each year at the Annual Parish Meeting that occurs on the second Sunday of Advent (December 8, 2019).

#### Here are the gualifications for Vestry eligibility:

"Adult" member (sixteen years or older) who has been confirmed and is faithful in corporate worship as evidenced by the receiving of Communion in this church three (3) times during the previous year, unless for good cause prevented; and, has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

- October 13, 2019: A list of eligible parishioners for Vestry will be posted in the Narthex. Please check this list for accuracy and notify the church office ASAP if any corrections need to be made.
- October 27, 2019: Nomination forms will be available in the Narthex and emailed to the church. Confirmed adults of the church are asked by the Vestry to nominate no more than 6 names from this list.
- November 12, 2019: Nomination forms are due by 4:30pm to the church office in hard copy or emailed to lkelly@stmaryskinston.com. All nomination forms must be signed or otherwise clearly noting the individual who is making the nomination.
